BACKGROUND

The African Development Bank's economic outlook report for this year indicates that the continent's economy, while stable and anticipated to grow by approximately 3.9% in 2025, confronts increasing geopolitical concerns and trade tensions. On a positive note, the report also indicates that for the past three straight years, eight (8) out of the 20 fastest expanding economies globally each year are African, with projections suggesting this number could rise to 13 by 2025. This growth must be underpinned by African countries leveraging key capital assets, the human capital being key. Africa must intensify training of quality graduates as well as deploy and retain them on the continent. This requires acceleration of investments in appropriate education equipping the continent's young population with 21st technical and social skills for work readiness and enhanced work transitions. Africa's higher education sector especially predominantly teaching agriculture and related institutions have a significant role to play. Growth in agriculture being the most effective way to ensure widespread reduction of poverty and better livelihoods for masses.

The RUFORUM 2025 AGM coincides with the launch of the refreshed continent-wide strategy Comprehensive Africa Agriculture Development Program (CAADP) 2026-2035 Kampala Declaration. The refreshed CAADP strategy focuses on building resilient agri-food systems in Africa, and is a vehicle for achieving the Africa Unions' Agenda 2063, whose Second Ten-Year Implementation Plan 2024 – 2034 (STYIP) aims to accelerate economic growth and development. These continental strategies underscore the necessity for Africa's higher education sector to proactively engage in development planning, resourcing, execution and measurement. Additionally, the STYIP Aspiration number six¹ specifically aims to raise Africa's contribution to global scientific research output by fivefold (10%), with at least half of the research output translating into innovations, enhanced production, and productivity. The CAADP Strategic Objective 6² stresses the role of strong institutions and human capital. The African Union's Youth Charter take cognizance of the need for multiple forms of education including formal, non-formal, informal, distance learning and lifelong learning as key mechanisms to equip young people with work ready skills. An integrated education system that could produce the right work force adding \$47 billion to Africa's GDP³.

As RUFORUM starts its 3rd decade of existence, it is imperative that the network aligns its mission to deliver the continent's development aspirations especially its human capital needs to unlock a demographic dividend⁴. This is important given the call to action by the continent, through its Youth Employment Strategy, (YES-Africa⁵) that aims to shape the future world of work for the continent's

young people through strategic collaboratives. This year, the AGM will be held in Gaborone, Botswana hosted by the Government and RUFORUM member universities. The AGM avails Botswana, Africa, and partners the opportunity to highlight the continent's contemporary development challenges and possibilities, as well as the atmosphere to co-create roadmaps for solutions. The conference theme is "Positioning Africa's Universities and the Higher Education Sector to effectively impact development processes on the continent."

PRE-AGM EVENTS

The AGM events annually start in July and this year, the pre- meetings events will include webinars, as well as online and in person training sessions in: Advanced data management and analytics in both biophysical and social-sciences; post graduate student supervision, young scientist mentoring sessions, proposal development, scientific writing and communication for impact; among others. Other pre-AGM activities include development of new graduate, post-graduate and undergraduate curricula involving shared and non-shared degrees; strategic partnerships between science-leaders within the Network i.e., centres of excellence, the Botswana higher education day (BoHED) and technology hackathons. These will be formally launched via a webinar.

OVERALL OBJECTIVE

The prelaunch event will be held as a blended meeting (virtual and in-person). The overall objective of this pre-launch meeting is to bring together the RUFORUM Network, the host country Government and its agencies, as well as other key stakeholders of Agriculture Knowledge and Innovation System (**AKIS**) to initiate dialogue and pave way for a successful conference in Botswana.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- 1. Analyse the essential factors for positioning African universities and the higher education sector to effectively influence development processes.
- Examine the integration of African universities into development processes and practices as a scientific solution and evidence provider for policy by identifying the imperatives, gaps, and opportunities.
- 3. Formally launch the first round of training events starting with strengthening capacity for research.

APPROACH

The blended meeting will be hosted by BUAN and will consist of plenary presentations and discussions, moderated by a facilitator. The meeting will be presided over by RUFORUM and the Government. The official opening will be made by the honourable of Minister of Higher Education.









Eminent personalities of the agricultural academia and AKIS stakeholders will present background papers and discuss key issues.

- 1. The imperatives for positioning African universities and the higher education sector to effectively influence development processes on the continent and actions agreed upon.
- 2. Processes and mechanisms for the intensification and integration of African universities into national development processes as equal opportunity actors as well as the imperatives, gaps, and opportunities identified and the actions agreed upon.
- 3. AGM training events formally launched to strengthen capacity for research.
